#### A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and memory of David Earl Weems; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens  
3 with the passing of David Earl Weems; and
- 4 WHEREAS, David Weems was born on November 8, 1936, in Atlanta, Georgia, a beloved  
5 son of the late Earl Grady and Martha L. Rapley Weems; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Mr. Weems leaves to cherish his memory a loving wife of more than 25 years,  
7 Carolyn B. Weems; son, Kelvin David Weems (Nicole); daughters, Karen D. Murph  
8 (Arthur), Cynthia L. Kindle (Lewis), and Mikita B. Lewis (Zach); and
- 9 WHEREAS, he served as a guardian of this nation's freedom and liberty with the United  
10 States Air Force, valiantly and courageously protecting his fellow Americans for 23 years;

- 12 WHEREAS, after retiring from the military, he began a career with the United States Postal  
13 Service, which lasted for 23 years until his retirement in 2002; and
- 14 WHEREAS, he was the Treasurer of the Bethsaida Woods Homeownership Association, poll  
15 worker at North Clayton Middle School, and a member of the Hospitality Committee for the  
16 Clayton County Homeownership Association; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Mr. Weems loved fishing, boating, cruising, traveling, and taking part in  
18 activities offered by the Corvette Club of Atlanta and was a former member of the  
19 International Council of Corvette Clubs and Vette Sette Atlanta; and

20 WHEREAS, he gave inspiration to many through his high ideals, morals, and deep concern  
21 for his fellow citizens, and the devotion, patience, and understanding he demonstrated to his  
22 family and friends were admired by others; and

23 WHEREAS, he was a person of magnanimous strengths with an unimpeachable reputation  
24 for integrity, intelligence, fairness, and kindness and, by the example he made of his life, he  
25 made this world a better place in which to live.

26 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
27 the members of this body join in honoring the life and memory of David Earl Weems and  
28 express their deepest and most sincere regret at his passing.
