## A RESOLUTION

Recognizing and commending Brooks A. Keel, PhD, for his dedicated service to advancing
 higher education in the State of Georgia, the University System of Georgia, Georgia
 Southern University, and Augusta University; and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, Brooks A. Keel, PhD, is a native son of the State of Georgia, born and raised
in Augusta, and a distinguished member of the Augusta community; and

6 WHEREAS, he attended and graduated from both of Augusta University's legacy
7 institutions, earning a bachelor's degree in biology and chemistry from Augusta College in
8 1978 and a doctorate in reproductive endocrinology from the Medical College of Georgia in
9 1982; and

WHEREAS, following graduation, he rose to the standing of an internationally recognized expert in reproductive medicine, serving as a member of the Society for the Study of Reproduction, the American Society for Reproductive Medicine, and the Society for Gynecologic Investigation, among others; and

WHEREAS, he served on numerous boards, including the American Board of Bioanalysis,the American Association of Bioanalysts as both president and chair, the Oak Ridge

Associated Universities, the Southeastern Universities Research Association, and the
Executive Committee of the Council on Research Policy and Graduate Education of APLU;
and

WHEREAS, as a basic science and clinical researcher, he served as principal investigator or
co-principal investigator on externally funded grants and contracts totaling more than \$26
million; and

WHEREAS, he is the author of 65 peer-reviewed scientific publications, 78 peer-reviewed
abstracts, and 19 book chapters and has edited four books in the areas of reproductive
medicine and biology; and

WHEREAS, he worked for 20 years as a professor and researcher before moving intoadministration; and

WHEREAS, while serving as president of Georgia Southern University (GSU) in Statesboro,
he focused on expanding undergraduate and graduate education through research and
community experience; and

WHEREAS, under his leadership, GSU launched the Allen E. Paulson College of
Engineering and Information Technology and the Institute for Interdisciplinary STEM
Education; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure at Augusta University, it has expanded its academic offerings
and campus infrastructure through the founding of the School of Computer and Cyber
Sciences, the School of Public Health, Augusta University Online, the Transdisciplinary
Research Initiative in Inflammaging and Brain Aging, the Immunology Center of Georgia,

the four-year Medical College of Georgia Partnership Campus in Savannah, a new College
of Science and Mathematics building, two on-campus residence halls, and a major expansion

39 of research laboratory space in the M. Bert Storey Cancer Research Building; and

WHEREAS, under his leadership, Augusta University's Medical College of Georgia created
the 3+ Primary Care Pathway Program to guide more medical students toward primary care
careers in Georgia to improve the health of all Georgians, particularly those in rural and other
underserved areas; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure, the Medical College of Georgia, Dental College of Georgia, and the College of Nursing have created partnerships to expand education outreach throughout the state to meet the critical health care needs of rural and other underserved areas as well as the evolving educational needs and professional career imperatives of health care students; and

WHEREAS, under his leadership, Augusta University increased enrollment by more than 27
percent, increased National Institutes of Health funding by 37 percent, and increased Augusta
University's economic impact on the state by 48 percent; and

52 WHEREAS, under his leadership, Augusta University is today the only university in the 53 country that has more than \$50 million in annual NIH funding while also being part of the 54 United States Cyber Command's Academic Engagement Network and in the top 5 percent 55 of universities that improve economic outcomes for students with low- and moderate-income 56 backgrounds; and

57 WHEREAS, he has been named to Georgia Trend's list of 100 Most Influential Georgians58 for 10 consecutive years; and

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- 59 WHEREAS, he is highly respected amongst his peers as a tireless advocate for ensuring all
- 60 Georgians have access to a quality education and world-class health care; and
- 61 WHEREAS, it is abundantly proper and fitting that the accomplishments of this remarkable
- 62 and distinguished Georgian be appropriately recognized on the occasion of his retirement.

## 63 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that

the members of this body commend Brooks A. Keel, PhD, for his dedicated service to the University System of Georgia, higher education, and health care in the State of Georgia and beyond as well as Georgia Southern University and Augusta University, without which students would not have access to quality education and research would not have been
