A RESOLUTION

Commending the Georgia Chapter of the Alzheimer's Association and recognizing
 March 1, 2023, as Alzheimer's Awareness Day at the state capitol; and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, the mission of the Alzheimer's Association is to eliminate Alzheimer's disease
and all other dementia through the advancement of research; to provide and enhance care and
support for all those affected by these diseases; and to reduce the risk of dementia through
the promotion of brain health; and

WHEREAS, there are now over 150,000 Georgians who have been diagnosed with
Alzheimer's disease and who are being cared for by over 338,000 care givers who have
accumulated over 640 million hours of unpaid care, valued at almost \$9.3 billion; and

WHEREAS, care giving for individuals with Alzheimer's disease often takes an enormous toll on family members; care givers themselves often suffer more stress, depression, and health problems than care givers of people with other illnesses; and

WHEREAS, more than half of all individuals currently living with Alzheimer's disease haveyet to be diagnosed; and

15 WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease kills more than breast cancer and prostate cancer combined;16 and

17 WHEREAS, nationally, one in every three seniors dies with Alzheimer's disease or another

18 form of dementia, and it is the sixth leading cause of death in the State of Georgia; and

WHEREAS, we recognize the important role the State Department of Public Health plays in promoting and encouraging healthy behaviors among the general public, increasing early detection and diagnosis of disease and disability, reducing risk of future injury and illness, educating the health care workforce, and monitoring the health of the state; and

WHEREAS, the Georgia Alzheimer's and Related Dementias State Plan was signed into action in June 2014, and we recognize the on-going collaboration and coordination of state agencies to advance the work to create a more dementia-capable Georgia; and

WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the Georgia Chapter of the Alzheimer's
Association be commended for its efforts in fighting Alzheimer's and advocating for those
living with it and their care givers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
the members of this body commend the Georgia Chapter of the Alzheimer's Association and
recognize March 1, 2023, as Alzheimer's Awareness Day at the state capitol.
