A RESOLUTION

- 1 Encouraging replacement of the term "illegal alien" with the term "undocumented person"
- 2 in the Official Code of Georgia Annotated; and for other purposes.
- WHEREAS, the State of Georgia will be among the states committed to respecting global
 citizenry by discontinuing the use of the term "illegal alien" in its compendium of official
- 5 state laws; and
- 6 WHEREAS, referring to undocumented immigrants as "illegal" is increasingly viewed as7 dehumanizing, offensive, inflammatory, and even a racial slur; and
- 8 WHEREAS, the terms "illegal" and "alien," when used in reference to people, have 9 undergone pejoration and acquired derogatory connotations, becoming more and more 10 associated with nativist and racist sentiments; and
- WHEREAS, the term "illegal alien" should be changed to reflect this state's commitment torespecting all persons and recognizing the humanity in all human beings.
- 13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ENACTED BY THE GENERAL14 ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA that actions should be taken to replace the term "illegal alien"
- 15 with the term "undocumented person" in the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
 public and the press.
