A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the Public Service Commission to pursue actions that protect electric customers from
- 2 paying for Plant Vogtle cost overruns and construction do-overs and that prohibit Georgia
- 3 Power from profiting on Vogtle construction mistakes and cost overruns; and for other
- 4 purposes.
- 5 WHEREAS, the original, controversial Georgia Nuclear Energy Financing Act of 2009
- 6 anticipated that Georgians would pay for construction and profits on prudent costs of Plants
- 7 Vogtle 3 and 4 that would cost \$15 billion; and
- 8 WHEREAS, the actual nuclear construction costs so far have been 100 percent more than
- 9 legislators anticipated in 2009; and
- 10 WHEREAS, the nuclear construction costs continue and are presently about \$100 million per
- 11 month with no reliable end date in sight; and
- 12 WHEREAS, customers have already paid over \$3.5 billion in nuclear construction
- surcharges, an average of \$850 per household, to construct Plant Vogtle; and

14 WHEREAS, Georgia Power's profits jumped more than 20 percent to an all-time high when

- 15 it began collecting the Vogtle surcharge; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Georgia Power has posted \$12.8 billion in profit since Vogtle construction and
- 17 the surcharges began; and
- 18 WHEREAS, the original Georgia Nuclear Energy Financing Act of 2009 did not anticipate
- 19 making people pay for expensive construction mistakes, costly delays, and expensive
- 20 do-overs; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Georgia Power testifies that construction is nearly complete; and
- 22 WHEREAS, many observers, including experts for the Georgia Public Service Commission,
- 23 anticipate that completing Vogtle construction will take longer than Georgia Power says; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Georgia Power's construction costs and completion dates have been wrong 100
- 25 percent of the time; and
- 26 WHEREAS, it was recently determined that nearly 10,000 required construction documents
- were missing; and
- 28 WHEREAS, it was recently determined that numerous wiring mistakes are being corrected;
- 29 and
- 30 WHEREAS, extensive ITAAC testing (Nuclear Regulatory Commission Inspections, Tests,
- 31 Analyses, and Acceptance Criteria) is far from complete and is required for an operating
- 32 license; and

33 WHEREAS, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission reports that, of the 399 ITAAC per

- reactor, 131 or 30 percent remain to be done for Vogtle 3 and 279 or 70 percent remain to
- 35 be done for Vogtle 4; and
- 36 WHEREAS, all ITAAC must be completed before nuclear fuel can be loaded and startup
- 37 operation can begin; and
- 38 WHEREAS, any problems found by testing likely will further delay startup beyond the
- 39 already-years-overdue recent startup claim of late 2022 for Vogtle 3 and 2023 for Vogtle 4;
- 40 and
- 41 WHEREAS, the nuclear construction cost overruns will continue until both Vogtle 3 and
- 42 Vogtle 4 are completed and online.
- 43 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 44 it would be unfair for electric utility customers to pay for Georgia Power's costs resulting
- 45 from mismanagement, delays because of mistakes, and construction do-overs at Plant
- 46 Vogtle 3 and 4.
- 47 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it would be unfair for electric utility customers to pay
- 48 profits to Georgia Power on billions in cost overruns at Plant Vogtle 3 and 4.
- 49 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of this body urge the Georgia Public
- 50 Service Commission to exercise its powers to protect electric customers from paying for
- 51 Vogtle cost overruns, construction mistakes, and profits on said cost overruns and
- 52 construction mistakes.

53 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized

and directed to make an appropriate copy of this resolution available for distribution to the

public and the press.
