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The House Committee on Special Rules offers the following substitute to HR 119:

A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the House Study Committee on Social Media Platforms and Accountability; and for
- 2 other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, censorship of speech constitutes an increasingly common and concerning
- 4 practice by social media platforms; and
- 5 WHEREAS, social media has an impact on youth mental health and self-esteem; and
- 6 WHEREAS, bad experiences on social media may lead to negative body image issues and
- 7 self-harm, especially with teen girls;
- 8 WHEREAS, social media platforms have mostly failed to adopt acceptable use policies; and
- 9 WHEREAS, social media may have a negative impact on issues of transparency and
- 10 consumer data protection, and disclosures of internal policies and rules by social media
- 11 platforms merit public scrutiny; and
- WHEREAS, the public's recourse to improper and inequitable treatment by social media
- 13 platforms is far from robust; and

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14 WHEREAS, foreign government influences and ownership of social media platforms may

- be, in certain instances, harmful to the interests of Georgians; and
- 16 WHEREAS, members of the House of Representatives shall review social media's impact
- on youth health and self-esteem as well as issues surrounding censorship of speech by social
- 18 media platforms to determine whether legislation is in order.
- 19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
- 20 (1) **Creation of House study committee.** There is created the House Study Committee
- on Social Media Platforms and Accountability.
- 22 (2) **Members and officers.** The committee shall be composed of five members of the
- 23 House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
- 24 Representatives.
- 25 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
- issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 28 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- 29 may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- 30 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.
- 32 (5) Allowances, expenses, and funding.
- 33 (A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided
- for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.
- 35 (B) The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member
- of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Funds
- 37 necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds
- appropriated to the House of Representatives.

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39	(6)	Report

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40 (A) The committee shall adopt specific findings or recommendations that include 41 suggestions for proposed legislation and the chairperson shall file a report of the same 42 prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to subparagraph (B) 43 of this paragraph.

- (B) A report shall be filed only if it has been approved prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee. A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
- 48 (C) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Clerk of the 49 House of Representatives a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu 50 thereof.
- 51 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2023.
