House Resolution 120

A RESOLUTION

1 Urging Congress to enact legislation to repeal the Government Pension Offset and the

2 Windfall Elimination Provision from the Social Security Act and for President Joe Biden to

3 sign that legislation into law; and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States of America has enacted both the Government
Pension Offset, which reduces the spouse and survivor Social Security benefit, and the
Windfall Elimination Provision, which reduces the earned Social Security benefit payable
to any person who also receives a public pension benefit; and

8 WHEREAS, the Government Pension Offset negatively affects a spouse or survivor who 9 receives a federal, state, or local government retirement or pension benefit who would also 10 be entitled to a Social Security benefit earned by a spouse; and

WHEREAS, the Government Pension Offset formula unfairly reduces the spouse's or survivor's Social Security benefit by two-thirds of the amount of the federal, state, or local government retirement or pension benefit received by the spouse or survivor, in many cases complete eliminating the Social Security benefit even though the survivor's spouse paid Social Security taxes for many years; and 16 WHEREAS, the Government Pension Offset has a harsh effect on hundreds of thousands of

17 citizens and undermines the original purpose of the Social Security dependent and survivor

18 benefit; and

WHEREAS, according to the Congressional Research Service, more than 700,000 people
nationally are affected by the Government Pension Offset and approximately 2,000,000
people nationally are affected by the Windfall Elimination Provision; and

WHEREAS, in certain circumstances, both the Windfall Elimination Provision and Government Pension Offset can be applied to a qualifying survivor's benefit, each independently reducing the available benefit and, in combination, eliminating a large portion of the total Social Security benefit available to the survivor; and

WHEREAS, the calculation characteristics of the Government Pension Offset and the Windfall Elimination Provision have a disproportionately negative effect on employees working in important government jobs, such as police officers, firefighters, teachers, and state employees; and

WHEREAS, the challenges of the pandemic have added to recruitment and retention
challenges for these workforces, and those challenges are exacerbated by the penalties caused
by the Government Pension Offset and the Windfall Elimination provisions; and

WHEREAS, Georgia is making every effort to improve the quality of life of its citizens and
to encourage them to live in the state, yet the Government Pension Offset and Windfall
Elimination Provision compromise their quality of life; and

36 WHEREAS, the number of people affected by the Government Pension Offset and Windfall

37 Elimination Provision is growing every day as more and more people reach retirement age;

38 and

WHEREAS, individuals affected by the Government Pension Offset or Windfall Elimination Provision may have no choice but to return to work after retirement in order to earn enough income to provide for their basic needs, but the earnings accumulated during this return to work can further reduce the Social Security benefits to which the individual is entitled; and

WHEREAS, the Government Pension Offset and Windfall Elimination Provision are
established in federal law, and the repeal of the Government Pension Offset and the Windfall
Elimination Provision can only be enacted by Congress.

46 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
47 urge the United States Congress to enact legislation to repeal the Government Pension Offset
48 and the Windfall Elimination Provision from the Social Security Act and for President Joe
49 Biden to sign that legislation into law.

50 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed 51 to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the public and the 52 press.
