House Resolution 1204 By: Representative Mitchell of the 88th

A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing February 20, 2024, as Girls Empowerment Day; and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, Trinity Girls Network, founded in July 2016 by Outstanding Georgia Citizen
Award winner Dr. Jacqueline Mohair, persistently works towards the empowerment of girls
and young women through a three-stemmed approach: ending violence against girls and
women; preparing girls for success; and providing opportunities through education; and

6 WHEREAS, globally, 65 million girls and young women are not in school, 31 million girls
7 of primary school age are not in school, and 33 million fewer girls than boys attend primary
8 school; regrettably, 17 million of these girls will never attend school in their lifetimes; and

9 WHEREAS, just over 120 million young people between the ages of 15 and 24 cannot read

10 or write, with 61 percent of this group being women; and

11 WHEREAS, half of the children who are not in school live in conflict-ridden areas, and girls

12 make up 55 percent of this total; and

WHEREAS, nearly 70 million children worldwide do not have access to a basic education;
more than half are girls, and evidence shows that educating a girl can break a cycle of
poverty in just one generation; and

WHEREAS, girls who receive an education marry later, have fewer children, earn higher wages, and support healthier and more prosperous families, emphasizing that the empowerment of and investment in girls are key factors in breaking the cycle of discrimination and violence and are instrumental in promoting and protecting the full and effective enjoyment of their human rights; and

WHEREAS, girls with an extra year of education can earn 20 percent more as an adult, and a child born to a mother who can read and write is 50 percent more likely to survive past the age of five; moreover, educated mothers are more than twice as likely to send their children to school; and

WHEREAS, the State of Georgia is blessed with hundreds of gifted girls and young womenwhose full potential has yet to be fostered and developed; and

WHEREAS, education is the key to the empowerment of this state's girls and young women,
fostering the development of their minds and academic and leadership skills as well as
playing a vital role in shaping tomorrow's leaders; and

WHEREAS, the dynamic collaboration of Trinity Girls Network, The Dr. Pat Houston
Performing Arts Academy, The Organization of World Leaders, and The Whitney Houston
Foundation converges annually at the Georgia State Capitol, serving as a powerful catalyst
to empower the lives of young ladies as well as a transformative event that resonates across

35 impactful proceedings held at the state capitol.

36 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that

37 the members of this body recognize February 20, 2024, as Girls Empowerment Day.
