## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the Georgia State Board of Medical Examiners and the Georgia Board of Nursing to
- 2 disseminate information concerning bone marrow donations to healthcare providers for the
- 3 purpose of enhancing public awareness of bone marrow donations; and for other purposes.
- 4 WHEREAS, since 1987, when the United States Congress authorized the establishment of
- 5 a national registry of volunteer bone marrow donors, the National Marrow Donor Program,
- 6 now publicly known as Be The Match, has facilitated more than 74,000 marrow and
- 7 umbilical cord blood transplants; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Be The Match states that the number of transplants facilitated through the
- 9 national Be The Match Registry represents only a fraction of the people who can benefit; and
- 10 WHEREAS, one of the leading hurdles cited in a report by the United States Government
- Accountability Office is locating a suitably matched, unrelated donor, a process that is often
- 12 difficult, time-consuming, and costly; and
- WHEREAS, seventy percent of patients do not have a donor in their family and rely upon
- 14 the national registry to find a match; and

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15 WHEREAS, there is a need to enhance the understanding of the importance of bone marrow

- 16 donation and to encourage residents of Georgia to participate in bone marrow donation
- 17 drives; and
- 18 WHEREAS, the bone marrow registration process is simple as it takes only a few minutes
- 19 and requires a cheek swab; and
- 20 WHEREAS, a bone marrow transplant may be the best treatment option or the only potential
- 21 for a cure for patients with leukemia, lymphoma, sickle cell anemia, and many other
- 22 diseases; and
- 23 WHEREAS, as the science of transplantation continues to advance, new diseases are being
- 24 treated with bone marrow transplants; and
- 25 WHEREAS, R.S. 40:1263.2 established the Georgia Organ Transplant Assistance Program
- 26 within the Office of the Secretary of the Georgia Department of Health; and
- 27 WHEREAS, through the program, the department educates residents of Georgia about the
- 28 need for bone marrow donors; the procedures required to become registered as a potential
- 29 bone marrow donor, including the procedures for determining the person's tissue type; and
- 30 the medical procedures a donor must undergo to donate bone marrow or other sources of
- 31 blood stem cells and the attendant risks of the procedure; and
- 32 WHEREAS, the department is also directed to make special efforts to educate and recruit
- 33 minority populations to volunteer as potential bone marrow donors; and

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34 WHEREAS, currently, no provision requires that the Georgia State Board of Medical

- 35 Examiners and the Georgia Board of Nursing disseminate information concerning bone
- 36 marrow donations to healthcare providers.
- 37 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 38 the members of this body urge the Georgia State Board of Medical Examiners and the
- 39 Georgia Board of Nursing to disseminate information concerning bone marrow donations to
- 40 healthcare providers for the purpose of enhancing public awareness of bone marrow
- 41 donations.
- 42 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the information the Georgia State Board of Medical
- 43 Examiners and the Georgia Board of Nursing shall provide concerning bone marrow
- donations to healthcare providers licensed by the boards, for dissemination to patients, shall
- 45 include the following: the need for bone marrow donations, patient populations that would
- 46 benefit from bone marrow donations, how to join the national bone marrow registry, and how
- 47 to acquire a free buccal swab kit from the national bone marrow registry.
- 48 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- 49 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
- 50 public and the press.
