## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the House Study Committee on the Georgia Public Schools Calendar; and for other
- 2 purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, mid-summer school start dates potentially cause logistical challenges for
- 4 working families; and
- 5 WHEREAS, students are bettered by opportunities to travel, by summer camp experiences,
- 6 and by family time; and
- 7 WHEREAS, many companies hire full-time and part-time summer workers from Georgia
- 8 high schools and colleges; and
- 9 WHEREAS, students benefit from employment opportunities available to them during the
- 10 summer months; and
- WHEREAS, employers benefit from the ability to employ high school and college students
- 12 during the summer months; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Georgia schools conduct facility improvement projects during the summer
- 14 break period so as to minimize disruption to student learning; and
- 15 WHEREAS, providing climate controlled environments for students during the summer
- 16 months potentially costs school systems considerable financial resources; and
- 17 WHEREAS, varied school start dates affect both employment and visitation opportunities;
- 18 and
- 19 WHEREAS, there is a need to coordinate high school and college or university
- 20 dual-enrollment program entry times to maximize benefits to the students; and

21 WHEREAS, the General Assembly needs to study the issue of early school start dates to

determine its social, growth, and economic impact and to determine an acceptable start date.

- 23 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
- 24 (1) **Creation of House study committee.** There is created the House Study Committee
- on the Georgia Public Schools Calendar.
- 26 (2) Members and officers.
- 27 (A) The committee shall be composed of nine members as follows:
- 28 (i) The chairperson of the House Committee on Economic Development and
- 29 Tourism;
- 30 (ii) The chairperson of the House Committee on Education, or his or her designee;
- 31 (iii) One member of the House of Representatives and one citizen member appointed
- by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- 33 (iv) One member appointed by the Governor;
- (v) One member of the State Board of Education appointed by the Governor;
- 35 (vi) The Deputy Commissioner of Tourism for the Georgia Department of Economic
- 36 Development;
- 37 (vii) The president and chief executive officer of the Georgia Chamber of Commerce,
- or his or her designee; and
- 39 (viii) The president of the Georgia Partnership for Excellence in Education.
- 40 (B) The chairperson of the House Committee on Economic Development and Tourism
- shall serve as chairperson of the committee.
- 42 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
- issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 45 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- 47 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.
- 49 (5) Allowances, expenses, and funding.
- 50 (A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided
- for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.
- 52 (B) Members of the committee who are state officials, other than legislative members,
- or who are state employees shall receive no compensation for their services on the
- 54 committee, but they may be reimbursed for expenses incurred by them in the
- performance of their duties as members of the committee in the same manner as they
- are reimbursed for expenses in their capacities as state officials or employees.

(C) Members of the committee who are not legislators, state officials, or state employees shall receive a daily expense allowance in an amount the same as that specified in subsection (b) of Code Section 45-7-21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, as well as the mileage or transportation allowance authorized for state employees.

(D) The allowances and expenses authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds appropriated to the House of Representatives; except that funds for the reimbursement of the expenses of state officials, other than legislative members, and for the reimbursement of the expenses of state employees shall come from funds appropriated to or otherwise available to their respective agencies.

## (6) **Report.**

- (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
  - (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
  - A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
- (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Clerk of the House of Representatives a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu thereof.
- 84 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2018.
