### A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing and commending Matthew Weidner; and for other purposes.

2 WHEREAS, an outstandingly athletic and studious individual, Matthew Weidner is known  
3 for breaking multiple Tallulah Falls varsity basketball records; and

4 WHEREAS, Matthew Weidner began playing varsity basketball during his freshman year  
5 wherein he scored a total of 52 points; then 438 points as a sophomore; 459 points as a  
6 junior; and 439 points as a senior; and

7 WHEREAS, Matthew Weidner has broken multiple records, including the all-time career  
8 field goal percentage record of 61.5 percent, the all-time three point percentage record of  
9 35.4 percent, and the single season scoring average record of 18.3 points per game; he is  
10 second by 0.3 of a percentage point for the all-time free throw percentage, which is currently  
11 at 77.8 percent; and

12 WHEREAS, this stellar young man epitomizes the courage, determination, leadership, and  
13 character necessary to attain excellence in athletic prowess and performance; and

14 WHEREAS, Matthew's success represents the culmination of a season of hard work,  
15 dedication, and excellent sportsmanship; and

16 WHEREAS, his superior skill, strategy, stamina, and control have earned him the respect and  
17 admiration of his teammates and challengers; and

18 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the superlative abilities of this  
19 accomplished and gifted student-athlete, as well as the pride, honor, and respect he has  
20 brought to himself, his school, and his community, be appropriately recognized.

22 the members of this body recognize and commend Matthew Weidner for his extraordinary  
23 athletic successes and contributions to his community.
