A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing March 28, 2020, as Progressive Multiple Sclerosis Day at the state capitol; and
- 2 for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, there are nearly one million people in the United States living with multiple
- 4 sclerosis (MS), a chronic, disabling disease of the central nervous system for which there is
- 5 no cure; and
- 6 WHEREAS, nearly 80 percent of people with MS may develop a progressive form of the
- 7 disease, characterized as progressive worsening of neurological function over time; and
- 8 WHEREAS, MS is between two and three times more common in women than in men and
- 9 is typically diagnosed when individuals are in the prime of their lives, between the ages of
- 10 20 and 50; and
- 11 WHEREAS, this disease can cause many symptoms, including blurred vision, loss of
- balance, poor coordination, slurred speech, tremors, numbness, extreme fatigue, problems
- with memory and concentration, paralysis, blindness, and more; and
- 14 WHEREAS, due to these symptoms and progression of the disease, people with MS; their
- 15 families, caregivers, and employers; and the entire health care system carry substantial
- 16 clinical and economic burdens over of a period of many years; and
- 17 WHEREAS, lost productivity related to loss of employment or the need to retire early due
- 18 to disease progression may be the largest single factor that contributes to the nonmedical
- 19 financial, familial, and societal costs of MS; and
- 20 WHEREAS, early and appropriate treatment, including the use of disease-modifying
- 21 therapies, can markedly reduce disease activity and accumulation of disability, potentially
- allowing patients to have a more active and independent lifestyle; and

WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the public be appropriately notified of

- 24 the severity and symptoms of multiple sclerosis.
- 25 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 26 the members of this body acknowledge the importance of education regarding the plight of
- 27 those with multiple sclerosis and recognize March 28, 2020, as Progressive Multiple
- 28 Sclerosis Day at the state capitol.
- 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- 30 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
- 31 public and the press.
