A RESOLUTION

- 1 Requesting more recess time for school children; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, some State of Georgia schools have shortened recess to 15 minutes per day to
- 3 make more time for test preparation; and
- 4 WHEREAS, the American Academy of Pediatrics cites 47 research articles that recommend
- 5 60 minutes of active unstructured play daily, explaining that children who get regular recess
- 6 are healthier, better able to focus, and develop the social and emotional skills necessary to
- 7 be engaged learners; and
- 8 WHEREAS, research also shows that children learn better following a break for physical
- 9 activity, and during recess, children develop social and problem-solving skills that cannot be
- 10 taught in the classroom, resulting in academic success; and
- 11 WHEREAS, children from Finland, who are provided with 15 minutes of recess for every
- 12 hour children are in the classroom, have some of the highest scores on international
- 13 standardized tests, much higher than children in the United States; and
- 14 WHEREAS, recently, when an elementary school in Texas, based on the Finnish curriculum,
- 15 increased recess to 60 minutes a day with four 15 minute breaks for children to go outside
- and play, teachers found that halfway through the year, they were far ahead of the academic
- schedule, also noticing that the children were more attentive, made better eye contact, and
- 18 learned concepts more quickly; and
- 19 WHEREAS, young children learn through movement, and a child who has an unmet need
- 20 to move cannot learn any better than a child who is hungry or sleep deprived; and

21 WHEREAS, recess is not an unnecessary break from needed instructional time, but, rather,

- 22 it provides children with the skills and physical foundation their brains need to learn
- 23 effectively; and
- 24 WHEREAS, in many families throughout metro Atlanta, children do not have a safe place
- 25 to play outside of school due to traffic, unsafe streets, or criminal activity, and some argue
- 26 that socioeconomically disadvantaged children have the greatest need for more test
- 27 preparation; and
- 28 WHEREAS, by depriving our children of recess, we are not improving test scores; we are
- 29 only creating unhealthier children and impeding learning.
- 30 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 31 the members of this body request more recess time for school children.
- 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
- 34 public and the press.
