- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Dr. Esco Hall Jr., the first black veterinarian to graduate
- 2 from the University of Georgia; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens
- 4 with the passing of Dr. Esco Hall Jr. on November 25, 2019; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Dr. Esco Hall Jr. was born in Wheeler County, Georgia, on February 3, 1948,
- 6 and graduated from high school as the valedictorian of his class; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Dr. Hall went on to attend Fort Valley State College, where he became a
- 8 member of several organizations including Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, where he served as
- 9 president of the Alpha Pi Chapter; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Dr. Hall was admitted into the University of Georgia College of Veterinary
- 11 Medicine, where he graduated in the top 10 of his class and received a Doctor of Veterinary
- 12 Medicine degree; and
- 13 WHEREAS, after completing his Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree in 1973, he moved
- 14 to Appling County, Baxley, Georgia, and purchased the Appling Animal Hospital, becoming
- 15 the only black veterinarian to have a private practice south of Atlanta, Georgia; and
- 16 WHEREAS, he cared for animals for more than 39 years and was dearly beloved by his
- 17 patients and their caregivers, who felt like members of Dr. Esco's family; and
- 18 WHEREAS, he served on the Baxley City Council for more than 29 years and held the
- 19 position of Mayor Pro Tem; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Dr. Hall owned and operated Baxley Funeral Home, which has been in service
- 21 for 21 years; and

22 WHEREAS, because of his great service to his community, Dr. Hall was frequently

- 23 recognized with numerous awards and honors; and
- 24 WHEREAS, his dedication to civic engagement was evident through his involvement with
- 25 the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (N.A.A.C.P.) where he was
- a life member; as a founding member of the Progressive Club of Appling County in 1977;
- 27 as a member of 100 Black Men of Southeast, Georgia, and the Appling County Development
- 28 Authority; as a board member of the Heart of Georgia Altamaha Resource Committee; and
- 29 as a member of Concerted Services, Incorporated, National League of Cities, Georgia
- 30 Municipal Association, Georgia Veterinary Medical Association, South Georgia Veterinary
- 31 Medical Association, and Fort Valley State University Board of Veterinary Science; and
- 32 WHEREAS, with all of his success, he was most proud of his family, including his wife,
- 33 Mrs. Ora Solomon-Hall; three daughters, Tanya, Regina, and Cassandra; three grandsons;
- 34 and five granddaughters; and
- 35 WHEREAS, a compassionate and generous man, Dr. Hall will long be remembered for his
- 36 love of family, friendship, and community and is missed by all who had the great fortune of
- 37 knowing him.
- 38 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 39 the members of this body join in honoring the life and memory of Dr. Esco Hall Jr. and
- 40 express their deepest and most sincere regret at his passing.
