A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the United States Congress to amend the Controlled Substances Act of 1970 so as to
- 2 reclassify marijuana as a Schedule II drug so that its medical benefits and effects may be
- 3 researched or, if Congress is unwilling to reclassify marijuana, to enact the Marijuana
- 4 Effective Drug Study Act (MEDS Act); and for other purposes.
- 5 WHEREAS, over half of the states and the District of Columbia allow the medical use of
- 6 marijuana; and
- 7 WHEREAS, more than ten states have enacted measures that allow patients suffering from
- 8 intractable epilepsy to use strains of marijuana that have low concentrations of THC; and
- 9 WHEREAS, the possibility of federal intervention has impeded the passage of proposed state
- 10 legislation and the implementation of enacted legislation to allow the use of low THC strains
- of marijuana for children suffering from intractable epilepsy; this failure to act has created
- 12 a difficult situation for law-abiding Georgia citizens and their families who have the need to
- 13 treat themselves and their children with debilitating illnesses; and
- 14 WHEREAS, the potential medicinal value of marijuana has received insufficient study,
- owing to a lack of financial incentives for the undertaking of appropriate research by private
- 16 drug manufacturing concerns; and
- 17 WHEREAS, in enabling individual physicians and their patients to participate in studies
- 18 conducted through qualified research universities for the investigational use of marijuana and
- 19 its derivatives, qualified physicians and surgeons will be able to study the benefits of the drug
- 20 in a controlled clinical setting, and additional knowledge will be gained with respect to
- 21 dosage and effects; and
- 22 WHEREAS, there is an urgent need for the facilitation of clinical research and the
- 23 development of cannabinoid-based medicines; and

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24 WHEREAS, Senators Brian Schatz (D-HI) and Orrin Hatch (R-UT) are cosponsoring the

- 25 Marijuana Effective Drug Study Act (MEDS Act), introduced in September, 2017; and
- 26 WHEREAS, the MEDS Act would take steps to remove barriers impeding research into the
- 27 benefits of medical marijuana and, according to Hatch, "encourage more research on medical
- 28 marijuana by streamlining the research registration process" without forcing the Drug
- 29 Enforcement Administration to reschedule marijuana; and
- 30 WHEREAS, it would "make marijuana more available for legitimate scientific and medical
- 31 research," Hatch further stated, and "protect against diversion or abuse of the controlled
- 32 marijuana substances."
- 33 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 34 the members of this body urge the Congress of the United States to amend the Controlled
- 35 Substances Act of 1970 so as to reclassify marijuana as a Schedule II drug so that its medical
- 36 benefits and effects may be further researched or, if Congress is unwilling to reclassify
- 37 marijuana, to enact the Marijuana Effective Drug Study Act (MEDS Act).
- 38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- 39 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
- 40 members of the Georgia congressional delegation.
