A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the House Study Committee on Abuse of Disabled Parking Permits; and for other
- 2 purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Georgia issues special parking permits to persons with disabilities upon
- 4 presentation of an affidavit by a licensed physician, doctor of osteopathy, doctor of podiatry,
- 5 optometrist, or chiropractor stating that such person is a disabled person; and
- 6 WHEREAS, signs mark designated parking spaces, and use of such parking spaces is
- 7 permitted only for a person with a disability or a driver of a person with a disability that has
- 8 a valid parking placard or license plate for persons with a disability; and
- 9 WHEREAS, family members and friends that utilize the permit when the disabled person is
- 10 not being transported are in violation of the law and are taking up valuable parking spaces
- that could be utilized for persons with disabilities; and
- 12 WHEREAS, some states, including South Carolina, are implementing a requirement that the
- 13 special parking permits include a recent photograph of the disabled person to deter the
- 14 practice and aid in enforcement; and

15 WHEREAS, it would be beneficial to study the issue to identify the extent of the abuse and

- 16 possible solutions.
- 17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
- 18 (1) **Creation of House study committee.** There is created the House Study Committee
- on Abuse of Disabled Parking Permits.
- 20 (2) **Members and officers.** The committee shall be composed of five members of the
- 21 House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
- Representatives. The Speaker shall designate a member of the committee as chairperson
- of the committee.
- 24 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
- 25 issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 27 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- 28 may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.
- 31 (5) **Allowances and funding.** The legislative members of the committee shall receive
- 32 the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia
- Annotated. The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any
- member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized.
- Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds
- appropriated to the House of Representatives.
- 37 (6) **Report.**
- 38 (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
- include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the

same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.

- 42 (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for 43 proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C) 44 of this paragraph.
- 45 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
- A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
- (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Clerk of the House of Representatives a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu thereof.
- 52 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2021.
