## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the House Study Committee on Civil Rights; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the Georgia House of Representatives is aware of complaints from individuals
- 3 regarding discrimination they face that makes it difficult for them to obtain jobs, participate
- 4 in society, and pursue liberty and happiness; and
- 5 WHEREAS, social justice and basic humanitarian principles require those who believe in
- 6 equality and openness to constantly seek out and uproot invidious discrimination in all forms
- 7 it may occur; and
- 8 WHEREAS, it is our moral responsibility to undertake a comprehensive study of the need
- 9 for civil rights protections for those unfortunate classes of people who still face
- 10 discrimination in our society today, whether in public accommodations, employment, or
- 11 otherwise.
- 12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
- 13 (1) **Creation of House study committee.** There is created the House Study Committee
- on Civil Rights.
- 15 (2) Members and officers.
- 16 (A) The committee shall be composed of eight members.
- 17 (B) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint four members of the
- House of Representatives as members of the committee and shall designate one of such
- members as chairperson.
- 20 (C) The Speaker shall also appoint one representative each from the United States
- 21 Equal Employment Opportunity Commission; the United States Small Business
- Administration; the Georgia Chamber of Commerce; and the Labor and Employment
- Law Section of the State Bar of Georgia as four additional members of the committee.
- 24 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of existing laws,
- conditions, needs, issues, and problems above stated or related thereto and recommend

any action or legislation which the committee deems necessary in addressing appropriate
responses to these needs.

- 28 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- shall hold at least five meetings and may conduct such meetings at such places and at
- such times as it may deem necessary or convenient to enable it to exercise fully and
- 31 effectively its powers, perform its duties, and accomplish the objectives and purposes of
- 32 this resolution.

## (5) Allowances and funding.

- 34 (A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided
- for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.
- 36 (B) The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member
- of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Funds
- 38 necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds
- appropriated to the House of Representatives.

## 40 (6) **Report.**

- 41 (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
- include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the
- same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to
- subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for
- proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C)
- 47 of this paragraph.
- 48 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of
- abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
- A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with
- 51 the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
- 52 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Clerk of the
- House of Representatives a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu
- 54 thereof.
- 55 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2016.
