A RESOLUTION

1 Recommending that local municipalities continue bail reform efforts by adopting

2 recommendations of the Judicial Council of Georgia's Ad Hoc Committee on Misdemeanor

3 Bail Reform; and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, the United States has long recognized that an individual is presumed innocent
until proven guilty (*Coffin v. United States*, 156 U.S. 432 (1895)); and

6 WHEREAS, the Supreme Court of the United States has recognized the fundamental right
7 to pretrial liberty for defendants awaiting trial except in carefully limited exceptional
8 circumstances (*United States v. Salerno*, 481 U.S. 739 (1987)); and

9 WHEREAS, the Judicial Council of Georgia established the Ad Hoc Committee on 10 Misdemeanor Bail Reform with the mission of researching nationwide bail practices, 11 interviewing interested stakeholders in Georgia, and producing a report on the committee's 12 findings to be shared with the Judicial Council and the Georgia Council on Criminal Justice 13 Reform; and

WHEREAS, the Ad Hoc Committee on Misdemeanor Bail Reform presented 20
recommendations regarding bail reform to the Geogia Council on Criminal Justice Reform;
and

WHEREAS, the Georgia Council on Criminal Justice Reform adopted some of the
recommendations from the Ad Hoc Committee on Misdemeanor Bail Reform which were
included in SB 407 (2018); and

WHEREAS, the members of this body feel strongly that local municipalities can continue misdemeanor bail efforts by promoting greater use of court appearance notifications through electronic reminders and plain language notices; by requesting that court notices be exempted from the federal 'opt in' requirement for text messages, like the exemption for medical

- 24 appointments; by recommending that the Uniform Superior Court Rules on pretrial release
- 25 be updated to allow for additional pretrial release options to be utilized at the discretion of
- 26 local courts; by collecting data on pretrial release and reporting it to the Judicial Council of
- 27 Georgia to determine the effectiveness of pretrial detention practices; by developing a bench
- 28 card for judges that outlines best practices for pretrial release; and by promoting judicial
- 29 education on adopted reforms and national research on pretrial incarceration effects; and
- 30 WHEREAS, providing effective pretrial release for misdemeanors will reduce the detention
- 31 costs borne by local jurisdictions and improve outcomes for the accused.
- 32 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 33 the members of this body hereby recommend that local municipalities continue bail reform
- 34 efforts by adopting recommendations of the Judicial Council of Georgia's Ad Hoc Committee
- 35 on Misdemeanor Bail Reform.
- 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- 37 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
- 38 public and the press.
