A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing February 26, 2024, as 100 Black Men of America Inc. Day at the state capitol;
2 and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, established in New York City in 1963, 100 Black Men of America Inc. has
4 grown from its initial nine chapters to now comprise more than 10,000 members and impact
5 over 125,000 underserved and underrepresented minority youth annually; and

6 WHEREAS, these founding visionaries included businessmen and industry leaders such as
7 David Dinkins, Robert Mangum, Dr. William Hayling, Nathaniel Goldston III, Livingston
8 Wingate, Andrew Hatcher, and Jackie Robinson; and

9 WHEREAS, 100 Black Men of America Inc. represents a national alliance of leading African
10 American men of business, public affairs, and government who work to improve the quality
11 of life for African Americans, particularly African American youth; and

12 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the efforts of this exemplary organization
13 toward promoting equality among Georgia's citizens be appropriately recognized.

14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
15 the members of this body recognize February 26, 2024, as 100 Black Men of America Inc.
16 Day at the state capitol.
