A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing February 26, 2024, as National Coalition of 100 Black Women Inc. Day at the
2 state capitol; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, the mission of the National Coalition of 100 Black Women Inc. (NCBW) is to
4 advocate on behalf of Black women and girls in order to promote leadership development
5 and gender equity in the areas of health, education, and economic empowerment; and

6 WHEREAS, their vision is for Black women and girls to live in a world where
7 socio-economic inequity does not exist; and

8 WHEREAS, NCBW believes in gender equity, inclusion, respect, racial and social justice,
9 integrity, accountability, economic empowerment, and collaboration; and

10 WHEREAS, the current agenda for the NCBW is to focus on health, education, economic
11 empowerment, strategic alliances, and civic engagement; and

12 WHEREAS, NCBW wishes to promote the awareness of Black culture, develop the potential
13 within its members for effective leadership and participation in civic affairs, take action on
14 specific issues of national and international importance, cooperate with other persons and

15 organizations in order to achieve mutual goals, and foster principles of equal rights and
16 opportunities; and

17 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the efforts of this exemplary organization
18 toward promoting equality among Georgia's citizens be appropriately recognized.

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
20 the members of this body recognize February 26, 2024, as National Coalition of 100 Black
21 Women Inc. Day at the state capitol.

23 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
24 public and the press.
