A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing May 25, 2024, as World Thyroid Day in honor of Georgians who experience
- 2 thyroid conditions, including Hashimoto's thyroiditis; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Hashimoto's thyroiditis affects approximately 5 percent of the United States'
- 4 population, and it more frequently affects women than men by a factor of 10 due to the
- 5 effects of different hormones; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Hashimoto's occurs when the immune system creates antibodies that attack the
- 7 thyroid gland. This process inhibits the thyroid's ability to produce natural thyroid hormones
- 8 and causes lower than normal levels of thyroid hormone in the body; and
- 9 WHEREAS, every cell in the human body has a receptor for thyroid hormone. The thyroid
- 10 gland is stimulated by the pituitary gland to produce several hormones, the most significant
- being T4. T4 is then converted by the body into T3, the active thyroid hormone. T3 must be
- 12 received by the cells in the human body for the cells to function properly. If there is a
- deficient amount of T3 circulating in the body and/or the cells cannot receive T3, the body
- 14 cannot function normally and systems break down. Low levels of thyroid hormone cause the
- 15 patient to become hypothyroid; and

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16 WHEREAS, every patient with Hashimoto's thyroiditis must take thyroid replacement

- 17 therapy to survive. Since the thyroid gland is unable to produce thyroid hormone in those
- 18 with Hashimoto's, they must take thyroid hormone orally in medications. Unfortunately, this
- 19 treatment is not effective for all people; and
- 20 WHEREAS, not every Hashimoto's patient responds well to thyroid replacement therapy.
- 21 Those who respond well can take the hormone medication and function with no problem. For
- 22 those who do not respond well, this condition becomes disabling. These patients can
- 23 experience severe health consequences that can affect their quality of life. It is a disability
- 24 that should be considered by employers and school administrators; and
- 25 WHEREAS, there are several biological steps between the thyroid being stimulated by the
- 26 pituitary gland to produce T4 and the necessary thyroid hormone getting into the cells. If one
- 27 of those processes does not work correctly, then the cells in the body cannot function
- 28 properly, leaving the body without enough thyroid hormone. The body becomes hypothyroid,
- 29 which can result in several negative outcomes; and
- 30 WHEREAS, symptoms of hypothyroidism caused by Hashimoto's include but are not limited
- 31 to exhaustion, lethargy, tightness in the throat, headaches and migraines, gastrointestinal
- 32 issues, brain fog, inability to concentrate, forgetfulness, hypersomnia (sleeping too much),
- 33 difficulty in going to sleep and waking up, hair loss and early appearance of gray hairs,
- 34 muscle/joint aches and pains, mental health issues (depression, anxiety), weight gain,
- 35 intolerance to cold temperatures, facial swelling, and dry skin; and
- 36 WHEREAS, inadequately treated Hashimoto's and undiagnosed hypothyroid symptoms can
- 37 lead to other related endocrine disorders such as adrenal insufficiency and insulin resistance.

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38 As time goes on without enough thyroid hormone, a person can develop other disorders such

- 39 as fibromyalgia, chronic fatigue syndrome, and more; and
- 40 WHEREAS, there is a need to explore alternative treatments for the hypothyroidism caused
- 41 by Hashimoto's, including but not limited to medical cannabis; and
- 42 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia should recognize Hashimoto's thyroiditis as a debilitating
- disease that can be difficult to control in some patients. Awareness of this condition needs
- 44 to improve so accommodations can be provided to those afflicted with it in school and work
- 45 settings.
- 46 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 47 the members of this body recognize May 25, 2024, as World Thyroid Day in honor of
- 48 Georgians who experience thyroid conditions, including Hashimoto's thyroiditis.
- 49 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
- 51 public and the press.
