- 16 Georgia, and Second Mount Carmel in Appling, Georgia, before becoming the Pastor and
- 17 Founder of Victory Baptist Church in Sparta; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Pastor Ingram was united in love and marriage to Annie, and was blessed with
- 19 three remarkable children and five wonderful grandchildren; and
