- beginning as a clerk for Joseph W. Hatchett, former Chief Judge of the Eleventh Circuit
- 12 Court of Appeals; and
- 13 WHEREAS, he continued his career in public service as an Assistant City Attorney with the
- 14 City of Atlanta Law Department and later served as Deputy County Attorney with Fulton
- 15 County; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Judge Willie J. Lovett, Jr., was a passionate advocate for children and in 2009
- was appointed as Fulton County's Child Advocate Attorney, playing an instrumental role in
- 18 providing legal representation for children in abuse and neglect cases in response to the
- 19 historic Kenny A. ruling; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Judge Willie J. Lovett, Jr., in recognition of his dedication and skillful practice
- 21 of the law, was appointed to serve as a Fulton County Juvenile Court Judge in 2013; and
