A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the Joint Head and Heart Student Health Study Committee; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, numerous middle and high school students in Georgia public schools
- 3 unnecessarily suffer or die each year from mental health issues or heart related medical
- 4 conditions; and
- 5 WHEREAS, heart related medical conditions may result from students being exposed to
- 6 excessive heat or exercise; and
- 7 WHEREAS, such schools may not have sufficient personnel to identify students at risk of
- 8 mental health issues or such heart related medical conditions; and
- 9 WHEREAS, the hiring of additional appropriate personnel in such schools may alleviate the
- 10 risks of students suffering from or death during an episode of mental health issues or
- 11 exposure to excessive heat or exercise; and
- 12 WHEREAS, an annual survey of these issues to be completed by such schools would be
- 13 helpful in determining the extent of these issues in such schools; and

14 WHEREAS, a study committee is needed to examine the extent of these issues and determine

- 15 whether annual surveys of such schools should be conducted.
- 16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 17 GEORGIA:
- 18 (1) Creation of joint study committee. There is created the Joint Head and Heart
- 19 Student Health Study Committee.
- 20 (2) Members and officers.
- 21 (A) The committee shall be composed of six members.
- 22 (B) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two members of the
- House of Representatives as members of the committee and shall designate one of such
- 24 members as cochairperson. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall also
- appoint an additional member of the committee. Such member shall be a nurse or other
- 26 medical professional.
- 27 (C) The President of the Senate shall appoint two members of the Senate as members
- of the committee and shall designate one of such members as cochairperson. The
- 29 President of the Senate shall also appoint an additional member of the committee. Such
- member shall have a professional background in child psychology.
- 31 (3) **Powers and duties**. The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
- issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 34 (4) **Meetings**. The cochairpersons shall call all meetings of the committee. The
- committee may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem
- necessary or convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform
- its duties, and accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.

(5) Allowances, expenses, and funding.

(A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.

- (B) Members of the committee who are state officials, other than legislative members, or who are state employees shall receive no compensation for their services on the committee, but they may be reimbursed for expenses incurred by them in the performance of their duties as members of the committee in the same manner as they are reimbursed for expenses in their capacities as state officials or employees.
- (C) Members of the committee who are not legislators, state officials, or state employees shall receive a daily expense allowance in an amount the same as that specified in subsection (b) of Code Section 45-7-21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, as well as the mileage or transportation allowance authorized for state employees.
- (D) The allowances and expenses authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds appropriated to the House of Representatives and Senate; except that funds for the reimbursement of the expenses of state officials, other than legislative members, and state employees shall come from funds appropriated to or otherwise available to their respective agencies.

(6) **Report**.

(A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that include suggestions for proposed legislation, the cochairpersons shall file a report of the same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.

(B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for proposed legislation, the cochairpersons shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.

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- (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
- A report so approved shall be signed by the cochairpersons of the committee and filed with the Clerk of the House of Representatives and the Secretary of the Senate.
 - (D) In the absence of an approved report, the cochairpersons may file with the Clerk of the House of Representatives and the Secretary of the Senate copies of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu thereof.
- 73 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2023.
