## A RESOLUTION

Honoring the men and women who have served, are serving, or will one day serve either in
law enforcement, the military branches of the United States, or as firefighters and
recognizing May 2023 as United in Uniforms Recognition and Memorial Month; and for
other purposes.

5 WHEREAS, men and women from the State of Georgia have taken the oath and pledge to 6 heed the call of those in danger at any time, serve and protect the citizens and properties of 7 Georgia, defend our freedoms against enemies both foreign and domestic, and be willing to 8 pay the last full measure with their lives; and

9 WHEREAS, the month of May currently includes International Firefighters Day, Police
10 Week, and Memorial Day weekend, all of which honor our uniformed heros for their service
11 and sacrifices within our state and nation; and

WHEREAS, from the time of the creation of the first department in 1736, the first police department in 1844, and the first military branch in America in 1784, men and women have raised their hands, swore allegiance, endured rigorous training, and given their lives for other citizens and loved ones in our state and nation both upon our soils and overseas; and

- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
  the members of this body recognize May 2023 as United in Uniforms Recognition and
  Memorial Month and honor those who have served, are serving, or who will serve in duty
  on behalf of the United States.

  and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
  public and the press.
