1 Congratulating poet Natasha Trethewey on receiving the distinguished position of 19th Poet

2 Laureate of the United States and inviting her to be recognized by the House of

- 3 Representatives; and for other purposes.
- 4 WHEREAS, Natasha Trethewey has long been recognized by citizens of this state for her

5 critically acclaimed poetry and creative nonfiction collections, now having attained the

6 position of 19th Poet Laureate of the United States; and

7 WHEREAS, she was born in Gulfport, Mississippi, and she received a B.A. in English from

- 8 the University of Georgia, an M.A. in English and creative writing from Hollins University,
- 9 and an M.F.A. in poetry from the University of Massachusetts; and
- 10 WHEREAS, her first collection of poetry, *Domestic Work*, won the inaugural 1999 Cave
- 11 Canem poetry prize, a 2001 Mississippi Institute of Arts and Letters Book Prize, and the
- 12 2001 Lillian Smith Award for Poetry; and
- 13 WHEREAS, her second collection of poetry, Bellocq's Ophelia, received the 2003
- 14 Mississippi Institute of Arts and Letters Book Prize, was a finalist for both the Academy of
- 15 American Poets' James Laughlin and Lenore Marshall prizes, and was named a 2003 Notable
- 16 Book by the American Library Association; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Natasha Trethewey was awarded the 2007 Pulitzer Prize for her third collection,
- 18 *Native Guard*, and her fourth collection was recently published in August, 2012; and
- 19 WHEREAS, her work has appeared in several volumes of Best American Poetry and in
- 20 journals including Agni, American Poetry Review, Callaloo, Gettysburg Review, Kenyon
- 21 *Review, New England Review, and The Southern Review, and she is also the author of a book*
- 22 of creative nonfiction, Beyond Katrina: A Meditation on the Mississippi Gulf Coast; and

- 23 WHEREAS, Ms. Trethewey has been the recipient of fellowships from the Guggenheim
- 24 Foundation, the Rockefeller Foundation, the Bunting Fellowship Program of the Radcliffe
- 25 Institute for Advanced Study at Harvard University, and the National Endowment for the
- Arts; and
- 27 WHEREAS, she has worked as the Lehman Brady Joint Chair Professor of Documentary and
- 28 American Studies at Duke University and the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill and
- 29 the James Weldon Johnson Fellow in African American Studies at the Beinecke Library at
- 30 Yale University, and she is currently the Robert W. Woodruff Professor of English and
- 31 Creative Writing and director of the Creative Writing Program at Emory University; and
- 32 WHEREAS, she is a member of the Fellowship of Southern Writers and the Georgia Writers
- Hall of Fame, and in 2008 Ms. Trethewey was named Georgia Woman of the Year; and
- 34 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the outstanding accomplishments of this
- 35 remarkable, dedicated, and distinguished Georgian be appropriately recognized.

36 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that

- 37 the members of this body congratulate Ms. Natasha Trethewey on being named 19th Poet
- 38 Laureate of the United States, extend to her their most sincere wishes for continued success
- 39 and happiness, and invite her to be recognized by the House of Representatives at a date and
- 40 time designated by the Speaker of the House.
