A RESOLUTION

1 Honoring the life and memory of Henry Louis "Hank" Aaron; and for other purposes.

2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of this nation's most distinguished

3 citizens with the passing of Henry Louis "Hank" Aaron; and

4 WHEREAS, Hank Aaron was born on February 5, 1934, in Mobile, Alabama; and

5 WHEREAS, he was united in love and marriage to his wife, Billye, and was blessed with
6 five remarkable children, Gaile, Hank Jr., Lary, Dorinda, and Ceci; and

WHEREAS, known affectionately around the world as "Hammering Hank Aaron," he played
for both Milwaukee and the Atlanta Braves and is recognized for his many accomplishments,
including breaking Babe Ruth's home run record during his phenomenal athletic career; and

WHEREAS, a distinguished gentleman who persevered despite bitter racism and hardship,
he finished his career as the 1957 National League MVP, a two-time NL batting champion,
a three-time Gold Glove winner in right field, a record 25-time All-Star, and the 1982
Baseball Hall of Fame honoree; and

14 WHEREAS, his legendary performance during his baseball career is complemented by his

15 honorable dedication to civil rights and his determination to speak publicly about the racial

16 injustice he faced during his life; and

WHEREAS, following his retirement as a baseball player, he went on to inspire new players
in his role as director of player development for the Atlanta Braves, a position he held for 13
years before becoming senior vice president and assistant to the president in 1989; and

WHEREAS, Hank Aaron gave inspiration to many through his high ideals, morals, and deep concern for his fellow citizens, and he possessed the vast wisdom which only comes through experience and the strength of character which is achieved through overcoming the many challenges of life; and

WHEREAS, an inspiration to many, he was a person of magnanimous strengths with an unimpeachable reputation for integrity, intelligence, fairness, and kindness, and by the example he made of his life, he made this world a better place in which to live and aided Atlanta, Georgia, in becoming the icon it is today; and

WHEREAS, a compassionate and generous man, Hank Aaron will long be remembered for
his legacy as an exceptional baseball player and civil rights activist and will be missed by all
who had the great fortune of knowing him.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that the members of this body join in honoring the life and memory of Henry Louis "Hank" Aaron and express their deepest and most sincere regret at his passing.
