## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the State Board of Education through the State School Superintendent and the
- 2 Georgia Department of Education to create multiple diploma pathways for high school
- 3 students; and for other purposes.
- 4 WHEREAS, in 2007, the State Board of Education voted to update high school graduation
- 5 requirements, which eliminated several diploma options in favor of the same diploma option
- 6 for all high school students; and
- 7 WHEREAS, the current diploma requirements have shown to be a one-size-fits-all diploma
- 8 not tailored to the needs and passions of all students, including those wanting to go right into
- 9 the workforce, technical college, military, or university system; and
- 10 WHEREAS, multiple diploma pathways can provide the opportunity for high school students
- 11 to have a pathway to graduation that reflects their post-secondary desires and passions by
- 12 allowing more opportunities to take courses of interest to students in addition to the core
- 13 courses all students need to be successful; and

14 WHEREAS, multiple diploma pathways provide more information on types of graduates and

- 15 increased transparency by providing additional public reporting categories (workforce,
- 16 technical, military, college/university) for better data on students' needs; and
- 17 WHEREAS, multiple diploma pathways will streamline counseling and provide students
- with a more relevant high school experience by tailoring a student's high school experience
- 19 around their post-secondary goals, increasing relevance and value; and
- 20 WHEREAS, multiple diploma pathways would be aligned to expectations, putting success
- 21 within reach for all students; and
- WHEREAS, multiple diploma pathways will expand options and opportunities for students
- 23 while not stigmatizing the diploma by eliminating the better than/less than mentality of the
- 24 prior tracked dual diploma option; and
- 25 WHEREAS, the State Board of Education must adopt new rules for high school graduation
- 26 requirements.
- 27 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 28 the members of this body urge the State Board of Education through the Georgia Department
- 29 of Education and in collaboration with post-secondary, military, business, and industry
- 30 partners to create multiple diploma pathways and adopt a new graduation rule to affirm this
- 31 change for high school students.
- 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
- 34 members of the State Board of Education.
