A RESOLUTION

1 Honoring the life of Mr. Bradley Scott "Brad" Vines and dedicating a road in his memory;
2 and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Mr. Bradley Scott "Brad" Vines long been recognized by the citizens of this
4 state for the vital role that he played in leadership and his deep personal commitment to the
5 welfare of the citizens of Georgia; and

6 WHEREAS, he diligently and conscientiously devoted innumerable hours of his time,
7 talents, and energy toward the betterment of his community and state as evidenced
8 dramatically by his superlative service to Haralson County as a District 4 county
9 commissioner; and

10 WHEREAS, a 1986 graduate of Haralson County High School, Mr. Vines was known as a
11 friend to the farmers of Haralson County, and he embodied the entrepreneurial spirit of
12 America as a small business owner; and

13 WHEREAS, Mr. Vines was a devoted husband to his wife Suzy, a loving father to his sons
14 and daughters-in-law, and an adoring grandfather to his grandchildren; and

15 WHEREAS, a man of deep and abiding faith, Mr. Vines was a faithful member of West
16 View Missionary Baptist Church; and

17 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that this remarkable and distinguished
18 Georgian be recognized appropriately by dedicating a road in his memory.

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ENACTED BY THE GENERAL
20 ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA that the portion of U.S. Route 78 from Pine Grove Road to the
21 Georgia/Alabama state line in Haralson County is dedicated as the Commissioner Bradley
22 Scott "Brad" Vines Memorial Highway.

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Transportation is authorized and
24 directed to erect and maintain appropriate signs dedicating the Commissioner Bradley Scott
25 "Brad" Vines Memorial Highway.

26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
27 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
28 family of Mr. Bradley Scott "Brad" Vines and to the Department of Transportation.
