## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the importance of creating multiple diploma pathways for high school students;
- 2 and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, in 2007, the State Board of Education voted to update high school graduation
- 4 requirements, which eliminated several diploma options in favor of the same diploma option
- 5 for all high school students; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the current diploma requirements have shown to be a one-size-fits-all diploma
- 7 not tailored to the needs and passions of all students, including those wanting to go right into
- 8 the workforce, technical college, military, or university system; and
- 9 WHEREAS, multiple diploma pathways can provide the opportunity for high school students
- 10 to have a pathway to graduation that reflects their post-secondary desires and passions by
- allowing more opportunities to take courses of interest to students in addition to the core
- 12 courses all students need to be successful; and
- 13 WHEREAS, multiple diploma pathways provide more information on types of graduates and
- 14 increased transparency by providing additional public reporting categories (workforce,
- 15 technical, military, college/university) for better data on students' needs; and

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16 WHEREAS, multiple diploma pathways will streamline counseling and provide students

- 17 with a more relevant high school experience by tailoring a student's high school experience
- around their post-secondary goals, increasing relevance and value; and
- 19 WHEREAS, multiple diploma pathways would be aligned to expectations, putting success
- 20 within reach for all students; and
- 21 WHEREAS, multiple diploma pathways will expand options and opportunities for students
- 22 while not stigmatizing the diploma by eliminating the better than/less than mentality of the
- 23 prior tracked dual diploma option; and
- 24 WHEREAS, the State Board of Education should adopt new rules for high school graduation
- 25 requirements.
- 26 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 27 the members of this body recognize the importance of creating multiple diploma pathways
- and support the adoption of a new graduation rule to affirm this change for high school
- 29 students.
- 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
- 32 members of the State Board of Education.
