House Resolution 409 By: Representative Marin of the 96<sup>th</sup>

## A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing April 30, 2023, as Vietnam Remembrance Day; and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, on April 30, 1975, the capital city of South Vietnam, Saigon, fell to the
Communist invaders from the north, changing the lives of many South Vietnamese people
forever; and

5 WHEREAS, approximately 125,000 people from South Vietnam fled to the United States
6 after the fall of Saigon in 1975, and significant waves of refugees arrived in the United States
7 in 1978, 1982, and 1992 as well; and

8 WHEREAS, South Vietnamese refugees were fleeing the harsh treatment and suppression 9 of human rights by an authoritarian government; ethnic, religious, and political persecution; 10 political executions of former South Vietnamese officials and their families; forced 11 resettlement in remote areas; and deteriorating living conditions brought on by food 12 shortages, flooding, and drought; and

WHEREAS, the United States played a significant role in aiding hundreds of thousands ofrefugees after the fall of Saigon, when more than 1.5 million Vietnamese were forced to flee

their homeland under the threat of deteriorating living conditions and widespread humanrights abuse; and

WHEREAS, Vietnamese Americans now participate actively in public life in the United
States and are distinguished in business, politics, the arts, sports, and humanitarian
endeavors.

## 20 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that

21 the members of this body commend the success of Vietnamese Americans and recognize

22 April 30, 2023, as Vietnam Remembrance Day.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
public and the press.
