A RESOLUTION

1 Honoring the life of Mrs. Annie Lou Glover and dedicating a road in her memory; and for
2 other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Mrs. Annie Lou Glover was born on February 21, 1899, in Milledgeville,
4 Georgia, a beloved daughter of Charles and Mary Washington; and

5 WHEREAS, the eldest of 11 children and the granddaughter of slaves, Mrs. Glover
6 graduated valedictorian of Eddy High School in Baldwin County and attended Spelman
7 Seminary; and

8 WHEREAS, Mrs. Glover dedicated her time, talents, and energy toward challenging and
9 inspiring the future leaders of this state as an educator in Dublin, Jasper County, and Baldwin
10 County, where she walked four and one-half miles each day to teach; and

11 WHEREAS, she was hired in 1934 to teach in Camden County, earned distinction as Teacher
12 of the Year in 1962, and retired from the education system after 49 years of dedicated
13 service; and

14 WHEREAS, Mrs. Glover continued to strengthen her own education throughout her career,
15 earning a bachelor's degree from Fort Valley State College; and

16 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that this remarkable and distinguished
17 Georgian be recognized appropriately by dedicating a road in her honor.

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ENACTED BY THE GENERAL
19 ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA that the portion of State Route Spur (E. 10th Street) from SR
20 25/US 17 to Cypress Drive in Camden County is dedicated as the Annie Lou Glover
21 Boulevard.

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Transportation is authorized and
23 directed to erect and maintain appropriate signs dedicating the Annie Lou Glover Boulevard.

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
25 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
26 family of Mrs. Annie Lou Glover and to the Department of Transportation.
