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The House Committee on Motor Vehicles offers the following substitute to HR 565:

A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the House Study Committee on Motor Vehicle Dealer License Plates and
- 2 Temporary Operating Permits; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, according to the Georgia Department of Revenue, there has been a dramatic
- 4 increase in the number of illegal temporary operating permits issued by Georgia licensed
- 5 dealers in this state and in other states; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the department reports that a substantial number of licensed dealers are selling
- 7 temporary operating permits, which is illegal, and improperly issuing multiple temporary
- 8 operating permits to customers when the dealers cannot timely process the title application;
- 9 and
- 10 WHEREAS, lawmakers and industry leaders have expressed concerns with the abuse of
- dealer plates used to avoid the payment of title ad valorem taxes on luxury motor vehicles
- 12 and to avoid personal responsibility for citations for moving violations and unpaid tolls; and
- WHEREAS, the department reports that it has discovered licensed motor vehicle dealers
- selling or renting their dealer plates, which is illegal, and even sharing forged copies of their
- 15 dealer plates; and

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16 WHEREAS, law enforcement officials report that criminals in Georgia and other states have

- 17 used the illegally issued temporary operating permits, rented dealer plates, and forged copies
- 18 of dealer plates to move stolen motor vehicles and drugs, avoid payment of title ad valorem
- 19 tax and title and registration fees, operate vehicles without passing required federal emissions
- 20 standards, and operate vehicles without minimum liability insurance; and
- 21 WHEREAS, study is needed to examine Georgia's issuance of dealer plates and temporary
- 22 operating permits to motor vehicle dealers, analyze trends, and make comparisons to other
- 23 states' laws and regulations to determine if legislative action is warranted in this state.
- 24 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
- 25 (1) Creation of House study committee. There is created the House Study Committee
- on Motor Vehicle Dealer License Plates and Temporary Operating Permits.
- 27 (2) **Members and officers.** The committee shall be composed of four members of the
- House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives
- and the chairperson of the House Committee on Motor Vehicles, who shall serve as
- 30 chairperson of the committee.
- 31 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
- issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 34 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- 36 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.
- 38 (5) Allowances and funding.
- 39 (A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided
- for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.

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(B) The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds appropriated to the House of Representatives.

(6) Report.

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- (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- 50 (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report subject to subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
 - (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
- 55 A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with 56 the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
- 57 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Clerk of the 58 House of Representatives a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu 59 thereof.
- 60 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2024.
