

House Resolution 621

### A RESOLUTION

1 Honoring the life of Lieutenant Hugh L. Moore; dedicating a bridge in his memory; repealing  
2 a certain resolution; repealing conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Lieutenant Hugh L. Moore was born on August 17, 1918, the beloved son of  
4 Mr. and Mrs. L.B. Moore; and

5 WHEREAS, a native of Nashville, Georgia, Lt. Moore graduated from the University of  
6 Georgia in 1938 and served as a guardian of this nation's freedom and liberty as a pilot with  
7 the United States Armed Forces during World War II; and

8 WHEREAS, he flew at least eight missions over Germany, participated in the Battle of  
9 Midway as a pilot of a Flying Fortress bomber, and went missing in action over enemy  
10 territory in Europe on July 28, 1942; and

11 WHEREAS, Lt. Moore's bravery and courage were recognized with an Air Medal with Oak  
12 Leaf Cluster and a Purple Heart; and

13 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that this remarkable and distinguished  
14 Georgian be recognized appropriately by dedicating a bridge in his memory.

15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ENACTED BY THE GENERAL  
16 ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA that:

17 (1) The bridge on Nashville Tifton Highway/State Route 125 between the Virgil T.  
18 Barber Bridge and the City of Nashville in Berrien County is dedicated as the Lieutenant  
19 Hugh L. Moore Memorial Bridge, WW II MIA Purple Heart Recipient;

20 (2) The Department of Transportation is authorized and directed to erect and maintain  
21 appropriate signs dedicating the Lieutenant Hugh L. Moore Memorial Bridge, WW II  
22 MIA Purple Heart Recipient;

23 (3) Part II and the second undesignated paragraph of Part XX of House Resolution 444,  
24 approved May 8, 2018 (Ga. L. 2018, p. 1004), are hereby repealed;

25 (4) The Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized and directed to make  
26 appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the family of Lieutenant  
27 Hugh L. Moore and to the Department of Transportation; and

28 (5) All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this resolution are repealed.
