A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the House Study Committee on Bureaucratic Hindrances to Businesses; and for
- 2 other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Area Development Magazine has ranked Georgia the number one state in which
- 4 to do business for the eighth year in a row; and
- 5 WHEREAS, however, bureaucratic hindrances continue to be a concern among the business
- 6 community, particularly at the local level; and
- 7 WHEREAS, many businesses find that local ordinances can vary greatly by city or county,
- 8 leading to great frustration and confusion; and
- 9 WHEREAS, other businesses find state agency rules and regulations difficult to locate and
- 10 to comprehend; and
- WHEREAS, state agencies, boards, and commissions continue to more create regulations
- 12 year after year, rarely repealing more than what is being added; and

WHEREAS, a comprehensive study of potential roadblocks is required to remove undue

- 14 burdens for businesses while maintaining a balance between public safety and economic
- 15 growth; and
- 16 WHEREAS, a review of state and local laws and regulations to determine what actions are
- 17 recommended to lessen the bureaucratic hindrances for the business community and the
- 18 citizens of this state is warranted.
- 19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
- 20 (1) **Creation of House study committee.** There is created the House Study Committee
- on Bureaucratic Hindrances to Businesses.
- 22 (2) **Members and officers.** The committee shall be composed of five members of the
- House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
- 24 Representatives. The Speaker shall designate a member of the committee as chairperson
- of the committee.
- 26 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
- issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 29 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- 31 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.
- 33 (5) Allowances and funding.
- 34 (A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided
- for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.
- 36 (B) The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member
- of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Funds

necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds appropriated to the House of Representatives.

(6) **Report.**

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- (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- 45 (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
 - (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee. A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
- 52 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Clerk of the House of Representatives a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu thereof.
- 55 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2022.
