## A RESOLUTION

1 Creating the House State Health Benefit Plan Study Committee; and for other purposes.

2 WHEREAS, the State Health Benefit Plan serves as the state's administrator of health 3 insurance coverage for state employees, teachers, public school employees, retirees, and 4 former employees, and their eligible dependents; and

5 WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the General Assembly to periodically review the 6 performance of insurers contracting with the State Health Benefit Plan to ensure that benefits 7 are being delivered as agreed; and

8 WHEREAS, there is a need to review, assess, and improve the benefits provided, streamline
9 the provision of services, and enhance the overall efficiency of the system; and

WHEREAS, a study is needed to determine possible legislative actions that would provide
quality coverage for State Health Benefit Plan members while ensuring actuarial soundness
and budgetary responsibility.

13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:

14 (1) Creation of House study committee. There is created the House State Health
15 Benefit Plan Study Committee.

16 (2) Members and officers. The committee shall be composed of five members of the
17 House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
18 Representatives. The Speaker shall designate a member of the committee as chairperson
19 of the committee.

(3) Powers and duties. The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.

(4) Meetings. The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee; provided,
however, that the committee shall meet no fewer than four times. The committee may
conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution. In the discretion of the
chairperson, the committee may meet jointly with a committee of the Senate that has the
same powers and duties of the committee.

30 (5) Allowances, expenses, and funding. The legislative members of the committee
31 shall receive the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of
32 Georgia Annotated. The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received
33 by any member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are
34 authorized. Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come
35 from funds appropriated to the House of Representatives.

- 36 (6) **Report.**
- 37 (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that38 include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the

(B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for
proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C)
of this paragraph.

44 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of 45 abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.

- 46 A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with
  47 the Clerk of the House of Representatives.

48 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Clerk of the

- 49 House of Representatives a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu50 thereof.
- 51 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 31, 2022.
