## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Charles Chester King, Jr.; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of beloved Covington native and honorary
- 3 Newton County historian Charles Chester King, Jr.; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Charlie was born to Louelle Mobley King and Charles C. King, Sr., in Monroe
- 5 on October 7, 1915, and was united in love and marriage to Sally Lambe King until her
- 6 passing; and
- 7 WHEREAS; he was a beloved father of two children, Sally and Barrett, and a host of
- 8 wonderful grandchildren and great-grandchildren; and
- 9 WHEREAS, he graduated from Emory University with a B.A. in philosophy and went on to
- 10 be director of the Civilian Conservation Corps camp in Pine Mountain, GA; and
- 11 WHEREAS, he enlisted in the Army and served with honor and distinction by courageously
- 12 protecting his fellow Americans in World War II as a Signal Corps combat cameraman and
- 13 later a Second Lieutenant and Captain; and he was honorably discharged in 1946, but
- 14 remained in the Army Reserve from which he retired in 1969 as Lieutenant Colonel; and
- 15 WHEREAS, after the war, Charlie received his law degree at the Atlanta Law School and
- 16 later joined his father's law practice; and
- 17 WHEREAS, he was named to the State Board of Workers' Compensation where he served
- 18 as deputy director and administrative law judge; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Charlie loved Newton County and was always at the forefront of historic
- 20 preservation efforts; he was instrumental in the initial work on the historic Brick Store in the

21 1970s and supported the county's acquisition of Gaither Plantation and the restoration of the

- Historic Jail; he later became a founding board member of Friends of Newton Parks; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Charlie was a community servant who never met a stranger and was loved and
- 24 respected by all.
- 25 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 26 the members of this body join in honoring the life and memory of Charles Chester King, Jr.,
- 27 and express their deepest and most sincere regret at his passing.
