## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Condemning Hinduphobia and anti-Hindu bigotry; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, Hinduism is one the world's largest and oldest religions with over 1.2 billion
- 3 adherents in over 100 countries and which encompasses an array of diverse traditions and
- 4 belief systems with values of acceptance, mutual respect, and peace; and
- 5 WHEREAS, the United States has always been a beacon of hope, progress, and innovation,
- 6 attracting people from around the world to create and live a better and fulfilling life, and has
- 7 welcomed more than four million Hindus from all corners of the world and given them better
- 8 opportunities and the freedom to practice Hinduism, also known as "Sanatana Dharma"; and
- 9 WHEREAS, the American Hindu community has been a major contributor to diverse sectors
- 10 such as medicine, science and engineering, information technology, hospitality, finance,
- academia, manufacturing, energy, retail trade, and so much more; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Hindu contributions of Yoga, Ayurveda, meditation, food, music, arts, and more
- 13 have enriched the cultural fabric and have been widely adopted in American society and
- 14 enriched the lives of millions; and

WHEREAS, Hinduphobia, as described by the Understanding Hinduphobia Initiative, is "a

- set of antagonistic, destructive, and derogatory attitudes and behaviors towards Sanatana
- 17 Dharma (Hinduism) and Hindus that may manifest as prejudice, fear, or hatred"; and
- 18 WHEREAS, there have been documented instances of hate crimes against Hindu Americans
- 19 over the last few decades in many parts of the country; and
- 20 WHEREAS, in July 2022, a report released by Rutgers University titled "Anti-Hindu
- 21 Disinformation: A Case Study of Hinduphobia on Social Media" detailed how hate messages
- 22 in social media translate into real life threats for people of the Hindu faith; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Hinduphobia is exacerbated and institutionalized by some in academia who
- 24 support the dismantling of Hinduism and accuse its sacred texts and cultural practices of
- 25 violence and oppression.
- 26 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 27 the representatives of Forsyth County in the Georgia State Legislature condemn
- Hinduphobia, anti-Hindu bigotry, and intolerance and declares Forsyth County as a place that
- 29 welcomes the diversity brought by Hindu Americans and all those who work hard, follow
- 30 our laws, uphold family values, and contribute to our economic and social well-being.
- 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- 32 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
- 33 public and the press.
