A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the House Study Committee on Front of Vehicle License Plates; and for other
- 2 purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Georgia law does not currently provide for front of vehicle license plates; and
- 4 WHEREAS, studies show that requiring license plates on both the front and rear of vehicles
- 5 improves public safety; and
- 6 WHEREAS, front of vehicle license plates allow law enforcement officers to see license
- 7 plates on vehicles approaching them, increasing law enforcement officers' ability to
- 8 apprehend criminals; and
- 9 WHEREAS, many after-market, no-drill front-plate brackets are readily available for
- 10 purchase, making a front of vehicle license plate an easy addition to a vehicle; and
- WHEREAS, a study is needed on what changes would be necessary throughout the Official
- 12 Code of Georgia Annotated to implement a requirement of front of vehicle license plates; and

13 WHEREAS, the Department of Revenue should be consulted and involved in the

- 14 examination of the costs and feasibility of a change to state law to require front of vehicle
- 15 license plates for all registered vehicles.
- 16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
- 17 (1) **Creation of House study committee.** There is created the House Study Committee
- on Front of Vehicle License Plates.
- 19 (2) **Members and officers.** The committee shall be composed of five members of the
- 20 House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
- 21 Representatives. The Speaker shall designate a member of the committee as chairperson
- of the committee.
- 23 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
- 24 issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 26 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- 27 may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- 29 accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.
- 30 (5) **Allowances and funding.** The legislative members of the committee shall receive
- 31 the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia
- Annotated. The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any
- member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized.
- Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds
- appropriated to the House of Representatives.
- 36 (6) **Report.**
- 37 (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
- include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the

same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.

- 41 (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for 42 proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C)
- 43 of this paragraph.
- 44 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of
- abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
- A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with
- 47 the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
- (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Clerk of the
- House of Representatives a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu
- 50 thereof.
- 51 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2023.
