## A RESOLUTION

Honoring William "Willie" H. Mays III; and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, Willie Mays III is the beloved son of the late William H. Mays II and Carrie J. Mays, the first woman to serve on the Augusta City Council; and

WHEREAS, a graduate of T.W. Josey High School, Mr. Mays attended Gupton-Jones College of Mortuary Science and Augusta College; and

WHEREAS, Willie is a third generation mortician and the owner of the W.H. Mays Mortuary; and

WHEREAS, he has served as the youngest president and chairman of the board of the State Funeral Directors Association, a board member of the National Funeral Directors and Morticians Association, the Eighth District chairman of GFSPA, and a member of Epsilon Nu Delta Mortuary Fraternity; and

WHEREAS, in 1979, Willie became the second youngest person ever elected to serve on the Augusta City Council at the age of 28 , a position to which he was reelected on two consecutive occasions; and

WHEREAS, he was elected to the Richmond County Board of Commissioners in 1990 and commissioner at large of one of the two at-large super districts in the consolidated government of Augusta-Richmond County, served three terms as mayor pro tem for the Augusta-Richmond County Board of Commissioners, and was elected to serve as interim mayor for the City of Augusta in 2005; and

WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that this remarkable and distinguished Georgian be recognized appropriately.
