- 2 WHEREAS, Dr. Eric D. Thomas, better known as "ET," has taken the world by storm with

- 5 WHEREAS, Dr. Thomas is a critically acclaimed author, world-renowned speaker, educator,

14 WHEREAS, while in Huntsville, Dr. Thomas preached and set up a program to help

- underprivileged youth. In 2003, he took a job with Michigan State University (MSU) along
- with a fellowship to attend MSU and complete his master's degree in K-12 administration
- 17 with an emphasis in educational leadership; and
- 18 WHEREAS, he worked as an academic advisor to disadvantaged students at MSU and
- 19 helped develop an undergraduate retention program called The Advantage with fellow
- 20 academic advisor and motivational speaker DeAndre Carter, which targeted academically
- 21 high-risk Black and Latino students. He also served as senior pastor at A Place of Change
- 22 Ministries (APOC Ministries) in Lansing, Michigan. He attained a master's degree from
- 23 MSU in 2005, and a PhD in education administration in 2015; and
- 24 WHEREAS, as CEO of his consulting firm, ETA LLC, Dr. Thomas has led his team through
- 25 the doors of dozens of hugely successful organizations and Fortune 500 companies, such as
- 26 General Electric, Quicken Loans, AT&T, Nike, Under Armour, New Balance, and UPS; he
- 27 continues to consult for major league sports franchises within the MLB, NBA, NFL, and
- 28 MLS; and
- 29 WHEREAS, portions of his sermons can be heard on the track "Intro" of deep house
- 30 producers Disclosure's 2013 debut album Settle and on the intro track "Wins and Losses" to
- 31 rapper Meek Mill's 2017 album of the same name. In 2020, he reunited with Disclosure to
- 32 speak on the song "Energy," which was released as the lead track from their third album
- 33 Energy; and
- 34 WHEREAS, by promoting his motto, "When you want to succeed as much as you want to
- 35 breathe, then you'll be successful," through a significant social media presence and regular
