## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing November 10, 2015, as Captain Henry Wirz Day; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the year 2015 is the sesquicentennial of the end of the devastating War Between
- 3 the States; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Captain Henry Wirz was the Commandant of the prison camp known as
- 5 Andersonville in Sumter County, Georgia, at the end of the war, which was surrendered to
- 6 federal control in early May, 1865; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Secretary of War Edwin M. Stanton, with the concurrence of the Lincoln
- 8 administration, chose to discontinue the practice of prisoner exchanges and ignore the
- 9 established customs of warfare for the humane treatment of prisoners of war; and
- 10 WHEREAS, in response to the capture of prisoners by combatants on both sides of the
- 11 conflict and the exponentially consequential overpopulation of prisoners in Northern and
- 12 Southern POW camps, Captain Wirz made extraordinarily compassionate efforts to alleviate
- 13 the suffering of the occupants confined in the Andersonville POW camp; and
- 14 WHEREAS, the recalcitrant Lincoln administration chose to ignore the appeals for mercy
- and compassion proffered by Captain Wirz on behalf of those in his charge, thereby causing
- 16 interminable suffering of Union prisoners; and
- 17 WHEREAS, he was subsequently held responsible for conditions beyond his control at the
- 18 Andersonville camp, unjustly accused of personal acts of atrocity, and was subjected to an
- 19 unjustifiable trial by the United States military against all principles of proper military justice
- and reasonable accountability; and

21 WHEREAS, the show trial of Captain Wirz was fraught with irregularities and injustices so

- as to use him as an example and scapegoat and cast shame on the government of the United
- 23 States and its military courts; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Captain Henry Wirz was executed in a barbaric manner before the public,
- 25 through cruel hanging and death by asphyxiation; his body was desecrated by being
- autopsied and parts were put on gruesome display, and his body was not returned to his
- 27 family for proper burial; and
- 28 WHEREAS, the United States government perpetrates this outrage by continuing to deny its
- 29 shameful acquiescence in these acts and refusing to apologize and restore the honor of this
- 30 man.
- 31 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 32 the members of this body recognize November 10, 2015, as Captain Henry Wirz Day,
- 33 recognize Captain Henry Wirz as an example of military scapegoating, and honor the
- 34 memory of Captain Henry Wirz with such solemnity and honorifics in Albany,
- 35 Andersonville, and elsewhere throughout this state as are customary and appropriate.
- 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
- 38 public and the press.
