A RESOLUTION

Urging Congress to allow certain benefits to be used for purchasing menstrual products; and
 for other purposes.

WHEREAS, menstrual products are a basic necessity for people who menstruate. Just like
food and shelter, access to menstrual products is crucial for maintaining personal hygiene,
dignity, and overall well-being. It is a fundamental aspect of reproductive health, and without
access to these products, individuals may face discomfort, embarrassment, and even health
risks; and

8 WHEREAS, menstrual products are considered to be medical devices and are regulated by
9 the Center for Devices and Radiological Health of the Food and Drug Administration; and

WHEREAS, for many low-income individuals and families, menstrual products can represent a significant expense. Allowing Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program; Women, Infants, and Children; and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families benefits to cover these products would ease the financial burden on those who are already struggling to make ends meet; and WHEREAS, ensuring access to menstrual products is a matter of gender equity and human rights. Menstruation is a natural bodily function, and everyone who menstruates deserves access to products that allow them to manage it with dignity. By providing assistance for menstrual products, Congress can help bridge the gender inequality gap and promote equal access to essential resources; and

WHEREAS, access to menstrual products is crucial for young individuals in school and adults in the workforce. Lack of access can lead to absenteeism and decreased productivity, affecting educational and employment opportunities. By supporting access to menstrual products, Congress can help individuals stay engaged in school and work, contributing positively to society; and

WHEREAS, inadequate access to menstrual products can lead to health issues, such as
infections and irritation, which may result from using alternative, less hygienic materials.
This can lead to increased healthcare costs, which could be prevented by ensuring access to
quality menstrual products; and

WHEREAS, inadequate access to menstrual products can lead to health issues, and menstrual
products can be included as a paper product or toiletry line item; and

WHEREAS, Congress is urged to allow Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program;
Women, Infants, and Children; and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families benefits to be
used to purchase menstrual products for the many important reasons set out above and to
raise the amounts of these benefits by \$20.00 to cover the costs of menstrual products.
