## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Supporting the creation of a State Workgroup to Increase Chronic Disease Information and
- 2 Screenings in Communities of Color; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, disparities in health outcomes are increasingly costly to the state, financially
- 4 and socially, but are in large part preventable; and
- 5 WHEREAS, people with chronic diseases, such as diabetes, heart disease, respiratory
- 6 disease, blood disease, lupus, HIV, and kidney disease, require seamless health care from
- 7 provider to treatment; and
- 8 WHEREAS, patients with these and other chronic diseases and their families, caregivers, and
- 9 employers and the health system have a disproportionately high economic, clinical, and
- 10 social burden; and
- WHEREAS, the overall well-being and management of underlying health conditions is
- 12 crucial for high-risk communities; and
- WHEREAS, identifying barriers to obtaining chronic disease information and screenings is
- 14 a first step toward breaking these barriers; and

15 WHEREAS, patients with these and other chronic diseases, particularly patients from

- 16 minority populations, have been disproportionately impacted by COVID-19 and are likely
- 17 to be disproportionately impacted by future health crises; and
- 18 WHEREAS, the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) acknowledges
- 19 that social and economic differences often create health differences in communities of color,
- 20 and that public health emergencies can isolate communities of color from necessary
- 21 resources; and
- 22 WHEREAS, the CDC acknowledges that COVID-19 death rates among
- 23 black/African-American persons and Hispanic/Latino persons have been substantially higher
- 24 than that of other persons; and
- 25 WHEREAS, patients in rural communities in this state are particularly challenged in
- 26 receiving adequate and appropriate health information and screenings; and
- 27 WHEREAS, it would be beneficial to create a workgroup to increase chronic disease
- 28 information and screenings in communities of color.
- 29 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 30 the members of this body support:
- 31 (1) The creation of a State Workgroup to Increase Chronic Disease Information and
- 32 Screenings in Communities of Color (the Workgroup);
- 33 (2) That the Workgroup be created and overseen by the State Office of Rural Health
- within the Department of Community Health;

35 (3) That the Workgroup shall focus on the development of projects to increase chronic

- disease information and screenings in communities of color, including the use of
- telehealth as a means to improve both;
- 38 (4) That the Workgroup consider the development of a program for delivery of chronic
- disease information, including screening information, concurrent with administration of
- 40 vaccinations;
- 41 (5) That the Workgroup shall invite, to the extent possible, individuals representing all
- demographics of Georgia, and shall include invitations of participation to, at a minimum,
- 43 the following members (a member can fill more than one role):
- 44 (A) A representative of a patient organization that addresses chronic disease;
- 45 (B) A representative from the Medical Association of Georgia;
- 46 (C) A nurse educator;
- 47 (D) A representative of the Division of Medical Assistance of the Department of
- 48 Community Health;
- 49 (E) A representative from a faith based organization;
- (F) A representative of a health care company;
- 51 (G) A representative from a federally qualified health center;
- 52 (H) A representative from the CDC's National Center for Chronic Disease Prevention
- and Health Promotion;
- 54 (I) A state legislator from a district that has a significant population of minority
- constituents;
- 56 (J) A representative of a local government consisting of a rural population;
- 57 (K) A representative of a local government consisting of an urban population; and
- 58 (L) A representative of a Georgia Historically Black College or University; and
- 59 (6) That the Workgroup report to the House of Representatives, the Senate, and the
- 60 Governor on the progress of the Workgroup within nine months of adoption of this
- 61 resolution.

62 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized

- and directed to make an appropriate copy of this resolution available for distribution to the
- 64 State Office of Rural Health within the Department of Community Health.
