## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Civil Rights Activist Ms. Dorothy Bolden; and for other
- 2 purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Ms. Dorothy Bolden was born in Atlanta, Georgia, and attended Booker T.
- 4 Washington High School before she became a full-time domestic worker; and
- 5 WHEREAS, as a domestic worker in the 1960s, Ms. Bolden and others like her would wake
- 6 at 4 a.m., leave home at 6 a.m., arrive at work by bus at 8 a.m., perform household duties and
- 7 management for 8 hours, and leave work at 4 p.m. to be home by 6 p.m. to tend to their own
- 8 households; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Ms. Bolden, who rode the bus daily to work, began using these settings as
- 10 impromptu meeting places for her and other domestic workers to discuss the long hours they
- 11 worked for little pay; and
- 12 WHEREAS, in 1968, Ms. Bolden helped start the National Domestic Workers Union of
- 13 America, which was not a formal union but an education and advocacy group that she led for
- 14 nearly three decades and that served more than 10,000 members around the country; and
- 15 WHEREAS, with the establishment of the National Domestic Workers Union, for the first
- 16 time ever there was a powerful voice working to raise workforce standards and improve
- wages; and
- 18 WHEREAS, under Ms. Bolden's leadership and guidance, the National Domestic Workers
- 19 Union pursued national and local legislation and started job placement and training programs
- 20 for workers that taught workers how to diplomatically ask for vacation time and higher
- 21 wages; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Bolden required all members of the National Domestic Workers Union to

- 23 register to vote prior to joining, allowing the group to wield significant power in Atlanta and
- 24 Georgia politics; and
- 25 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper for this body to honor the life and memory
- and the extraordinary accomplishments of Civil Rights Activist Ms. Dorothy Bolden.
- 27 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 28 the members of this body honor the life and memory of Ms. Dorothy Bolden and recognize
- 29 the dedication and commitment to civil rights of this amazing activist.
- 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- 31 and directed to make an appropriate copy of this resolution available for distribution to the
- 32 family of Ms. Dorothy Bolden.
