A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging Congress to renew or extend the Affordable Connectivity Program through 2024 so
- 2 that all qualifying households in Georgia will have access to affordable high-speed internet
- 3 service; and for other purposes.
- 4 WHEREAS, equity in education, in healthcare, in the workforce, and in all aspects of modern
- 5 life is only achievable if one has a computer, an internet connection, and digital skills; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) was enacted through the bipartisan
- 7 Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021 to make high-speed internet plans more
- 8 affordable for consumers and to encourage internet service providers (ISPs) to invest in more
- 9 communities; and
- 10 WHEREAS, ISPs that receive federal infrastructure deployment funds are mandated to
- 11 participate in the ACP so that future customers will not be priced out of those new
- 12 connections; and
- 13 WHEREAS, the ACP has provided \$14.2 billion in support since its inception, allowing over
- 14 20 million American households to benefit from the ACP, including 625,000 households in
- 15 Georgia; and

16 WHEREAS, many households in Georgia risk disconnection from their internet service if

- 17 the ACP is not continued, leaving those families without access to healthcare services, school
- 18 programming, and workforce opportunities; and
- 19 WHEREAS, polls have shown that over 75 percent of voters support funding for the ACP,
- 20 including overwhelming support across political ideologies; and
- 21 WHEREAS, unless Congress acts to renew or extend the ACP, its funds will be exhausted
- 22 by spring in 2024, leaving millions of Americans without affordable access to internet
- 23 service; and
- 24 WHEREAS, without the ACP, American tax dollars will be supporting the growth of for
- 25 profit ISPs with no public benefit; and
- 26 WHEREAS, on January 11, 2024, the Federal Communications Commission announced that
- 27 it will wind down the ACP and will stop accepting new enrollments on February 7, 2024,
- 28 unless Congress appropriates additional funding.
- 29 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 30 the members of this body acknowledge the importance of digital equity for all citizens and
- 31 urge Congress to renew or extend the Affordable Connectivity Program through 2024, so that
- 32 all qualifying households in Georgia will have access to affordable high-speed internet
- 33 service.
- 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- 35 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to
