A RESOLUTION

1 Honoring the life of Mr. Edward "Kip" William Klein III and dedicating an intersection in
2 his memory; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Mr. Edward "Kip" William Klein III has long been recognized by the citizens
4 of this state for the vital role that he has played in leadership and his deep personal
5 commitment to the welfare of the citizens of Georgia; and

6 WHEREAS, an attorney from Marietta, Georgia, Mr. Klein served in the General Assembly
7 from 1991 to 1997 and ran for the Republican nomination for Georgia Attorney General in
8 1998; and

9 WHEREAS, he worked closely with United States Senator Johnny Isakson to promote
10 research using select embryonic stem cells in the fight to find a cure for Parkinson's disease;
11 and

12 WHEREAS, Mr. Klein served as a member of the Cobb County Chamber of Commerce, a
13 board member of the Feed the Hungry Foundation, and as a deacon and Sunday school
14 teacher at First Baptist Church of Atlanta; and

15 WHEREAS, he gave inspiration to many through his high ideals, morals, and deep concern
16 for his fellow citizens, and the devotion, patience, and understanding he demonstrated to his
17 family and friends were admired by others; and

18 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that this remarkable and distinguished
19 Georgian be recognized appropriately by dedicating an intersection in his memory.

20 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ENACTED BY THE GENERAL
21 ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA that the intersection of State Route 92 and Sandy Plains Road
22 in Cobb County is dedicated as the Kip Klein Memorial Intersection.

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Transportation is authorized and
24 directed to erect and maintain appropriate signs dedicating the Kip Klein Memorial
25 Intersection.

26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
27 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
28 family of Mr. Edward "Kip" William Klein III and to the Department of Transportation.
