Honoring the life of Mr. Edward "Kip" William Klein III and dedicating an intersection in
 his memory; and for other purposes.

board member of the Feed the Hungry Foundation, and as a deacon and Sunday school
teacher at First Baptist Church of Atlanta; and

20 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ENACTED BY THE GENERAL

21 ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA that the intersection of State Route 92 and Sandy Plains Road

22 in Cobb County is dedicated as the Kip Klein Memorial Intersection.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Transportation is authorized and
directed to erect and maintain appropriate signs dedicating the Kip Klein Memorial
Intersection.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
family of Mr. Edward "Kip" William Klein III and to the Department of Transportation.
