A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing the problem of untreated and undertreated chronic pain and commending the

2 Institute of Medicine for its report on how to address the problem of chronic pain; and for

3 other purposes.

4 WHEREAS, over 100 million adults suffer from chronic pain, including millions with 5 debilitating conditions like chronic lower back pain, fibromyalgia, and arthritis; and

6 WHEREAS, chronic pain costs America up to \$635 billion a year in added health costs and

7 lost productivity, including billions of dollars in state Medicaid costs; and

8 WHEREAS, chronic pain is a major public health problem and a hidden driver of rising9 health care costs; and

WHEREAS, significant barriers to adequate pain care exist, and millions of Americans get
inadequate pain care; and

WHEREAS, these findings were made by the prestigious Institute of Medicine (IOM) of the
National Academy of Sciences in its landmark report issued in 2011, *Relieving Pain in America: A Blueprint for Transforming Prevention, Care, Education, and Research*; and

WHEREAS, the IOM report includes a number of recommendations to improve pain care,education, and research; and

WHEREAS, the IOM report found that significant savings could be achieved through better
treatment of acute pain, reduction in workers' compensation costs and lost tax revenues, and
a reduced burden of opioid abuse and misuse.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
 the members of this body do hereby recognize the problem of untreated and undertreated
