## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing January 14, 2016, as Sportsmen's and Coastal Day at the capitol; and for other
- 2 purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Georgia is one of the most geographically and biologically diverse areas in the
- 4 nation with abundant plant and animal populations that provide its citizens with unrivaled
- 5 opportunities for recreation and commerce while also sustaining a quality of life that makes
- 6 this state a great place to live and work; and
- 7 WHEREAS, coastal Georgia is a particularly unique part of this diverse state with a half
- 8 million acres of estuaries, 3,000 miles of tidal waterways, a chain of 14 barrier islands, and
- 9 300 square miles of open Atlantic Ocean; and
- 10 WHEREAS, coastal Georgia produces fresh seafood shrimp, blue crabs, fish, and oysters -
- 11 that is enjoyed by residents and visitors alike while also providing an estimated \$45 million
- 12 of economic impact; and
- WHEREAS, each year, over one million Georgia residents enjoy hunting and fishing from
- 14 the Blue Ridge Mountains to the Atlantic Ocean; and
- 15 WHEREAS, hunting and fishing, both freshwater and saltwater, generate \$216 million in
- state and local tax revenue annually, directly support 39,600 jobs in Georgia, and have a total
- 17 economic impact of over \$3.8 billion annually; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Georgia ranks among the top hunting destinations thanks to its abundant
- 19 wildlife populations and accessible wildlife habitat; and
- 20 WHEREAS, hunting and fishing license fees are the primary funding source for operating
- 21 more than one million acres of wildlife management areas in Georgia, which provide a
- 22 myriad of recreational and educational opportunities; and

WHEREAS, hunting and fishing license fees as well as excise taxes paid on hunting and

- 24 fishing equipment have funded the successful restoration of numerous wildlife and fish
- 25 species including white-tailed deer, wild turkey, black bear, wood ducks, brook trout, and red
- 26 drum; and
- 27 WHEREAS, the sportsmen and sportswomen of Georgia and the conservation organizations
- 28 that they support work to preserve our state's natural lands and wildlife, which includes
- 29 non-game and game animals.
- 30 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 31 the members of this body hereby recognize January 14, 2016, as Sportsmen's and Coastal
- 32 Day at the capitol.
- 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- and directed to make an appropriate copy of the resolution available for distribution to the
- 35 Georgia Legislative Sportsmen's Caucus.
